There are many other issues on this ballot. It is also important to select our future leaders at the local, state and national level. This important townhall allows AHS to connect with our patients, share with you what we are doing, and to hear from you directly. Protecting Patient Privacy

At Asian Health Services, protecting your personal health information (name, date of birth, phone number) is important to us. During your visit, different staff may ask you to confirm this information to ensure privacy and accuracy in delivering documents (letters, lab results, referrals, etc.). While it may seem repetitive, this practice safeguards your privacy by ensuring your information is shared only with you.



Practice using your Smartphone:

<u>Be Prepared for Any</u> <u>**Disaster**</u>

With just a few easy steps, you can ensure that you and your loved ones are safe in case of an emergency.

- 1. **Sign up for disaster alerts:** Go to CalAlerts.org to receive updates / Download MyShake app / Call or text 211 for evacuation routes and emergency shelters
- 2. **Make a plan!** Create a contact list (family, friends, etc.), and a local resource directory (fire department, police, power, gas, etc.) and plan your evacuation route
- 3. **Pack a GO BAG** with items you would need if you must quickly evacuate your home.
- 4. **Make a STAY BOX** if you must stay in your home without power or water. (Scan the QR code for a detailed packing checklist)
- 5. **Help others be prepared** by starting conversations with people in your neighborhood

MyChart Patient Portal



In November 2023, Asian Health Services launched the MyChart patient portal, receiving positive feedback from patients. *MyChart gives you online access to your medical record for non-urgent appointments, test results, and medication refills.* It's easy to use and puts you in control of your healthcare.

If you haven't signed up yet, here's how to get started:

- If you're new to MyChart, ask one of our staff members for an activation code during your next clinic visit. Alternatively, you can sign up online using your email address.
- Once you have your activation code, visit the MyChart website or download the app to create your account. Follow the prompts to enter your activation code and complete the registration process.
- Now you're ready to explore all that MyChart has to offer!

2024 GENERAL ELECTION – VOTING FOR OUR HEALTH

Voting matters for the health and well-being of our community! On November 5th, 2024, U.S. citizens 18 and older are eligible to vote. This election will decide who governs our city, county, state, and nation, including our next President.

What do elections affect?

Voting for officials like city council members, county supervisors, and the governor influences issues like school funding, affordable housing, mental health, and healthcare.

Asian Americans have grown significantly, and we have voting power. In 2020, during the presidential election, Asian Americans had the largest increase in voter turn-out, by 15% or about 2 million eligible voters, compared to 2016. This population can have an impact if all eligible voters vote in the election.

For the November 5th, 2024 General Election:

- Vote-by-mail ballots will be sent by October 7th.
- The last day to register is October 21st.
- The deadline to request a replacement ballot is October 29th.



Qualifications to Register to Vote

To register to vote in California, you must be:

- A United States citizen and a resident of California (for information on voters in the military or overseas, please scan QR code #1)
- 18 years old or older on Election Day
- · Registered where you currently live
- Not currently serving a state or federal prison term for a felony <u>(QR code #2)</u>
- Not found mentally incompetent to vote by a court (QR code #3)

California Online Voter Registration: (QR code #4)



Online Voter Registration provides 9 languages: English, Chinese, Hindi, Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog, Thai, and Vietnamese.

To register online you will need:

- Your California driver's license or California Identification card number
- The last four digits of your social security number
- Your date of birth.
