As I reflect on another year, I am filled with pride and gratitude to our staff, supporters, and our community for your commitment to ensuring health care – rooted in language and culture – remains accessible and a fundamental human right for our community. As we continue to recover from the impact of the global pandemic and anti-Asian violence, I have witnessed the resilience of our organization and strength of our collective efforts. I am honored to share reflections that we have accomplished together.

We were recognized as one of the top-performing health centers in the nation for quality care. We launched several groundbreaking initiatives to improve care for our patients and community. Among them, the creation of the **first AAPI Behavioral Health Training Academy** to cultivate a diverse, community-rooted workforce, and the implementation of **Remote Patient Monitoring** for more than 800 high-risk hypertensive patients. We also introduced a new **Mobile Medical & Dental Clinic Van**, announced the future **San Leandro Dental Clinic** to expand our reach to underserved populations, and provided **Trauma-Informed Care and Counseling** for survivors of anti-Asian violence and discrimination.

Through your support, the challenges in our community have become the catalyst for creativity and innovation. Collectively, we have explored new ways to meet the needs of our diverse patient population, and introduced various integrated and enhanced services that are becoming a new model of care.

We are fostering a future where access to high-quality health care is not just a goal, but a reality for all. The work we do is possible because of you. Thank you.

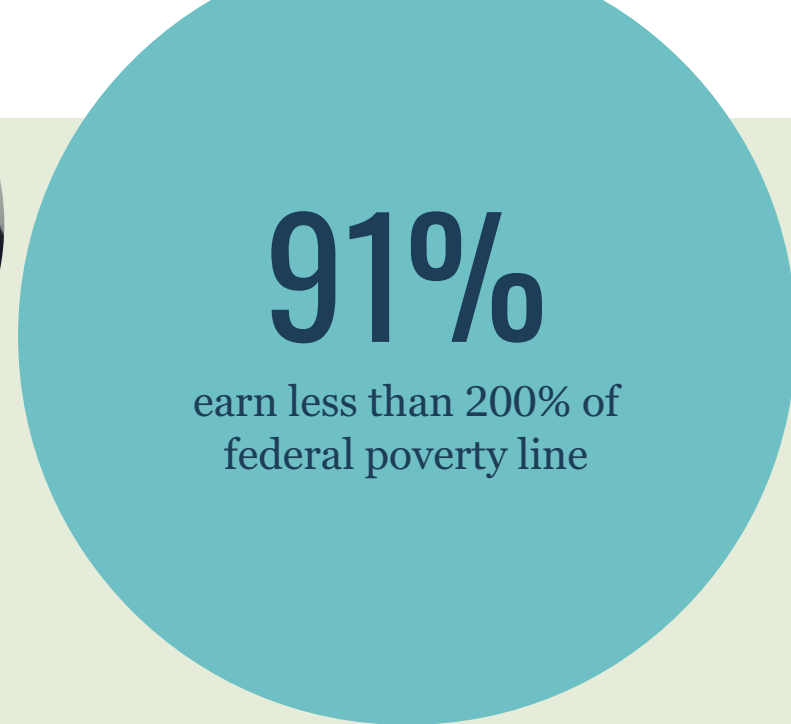


Community Impact

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT

Remote Patient Monitoring

Asian Health Services launched their Remote Patient Monitoring program in 2021 in the face of COVID-19 and rise of anti-Asian violence. Many of our patients were afraid to leave their home and we needed to find an innovative approach to managing our highest-risk hypertensive patients. Through the Smart Hypertensive Improvement Project (SHIP), we were able to monitor our patients' blood pressure and heart rate remotely from the comfort of our patients' own home. 312 patients enrolled in the SHIP RPM Program in 2023. As of 2023, 803 patients have been given a smart blood pressure device through SHIP. To date, 89% of patients enrolled in the SHIP program either showed significant improvement or reached their goal.



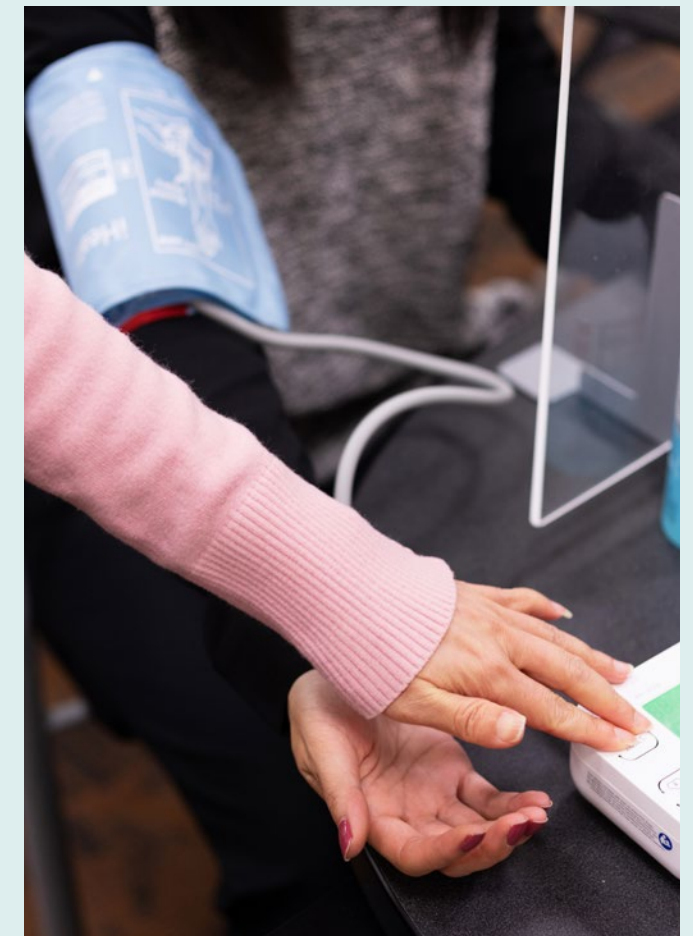
PATIENT STORY

The AHS Remote Patient Monitoring program has been an integral innovation

in keeping our patients healthy. In one instance, AHS providers were notified of a patient's heart rate dropping to low rates. After reviewing medical records and medications with the patient, the AHS provider discovered that an outside specialist had recently prescribed medication that was significantly lowering the patient's heart rate.

Because of the hypertensive monitoring device and SHIP program, further complications were prevented and the patient received the rapid response care he needed.

Our Health Coaches also monitor and call participating patients on a regular basis. In another instance, an AHS Health Coach called a patient after being notified of higher-than-normal blood pressure. During the conversation, the patient expressed pain in their toes which prompted an appointment and diagnosis of a gout attack. The remote patient monitoring program allows for quick diagnosis and treatment of potentially life threatening issues for the most vulnerable of our patients.
